Call for Nominations to serve as a STEM-NET Faculty Fellow

Deadline: Monday, March 11, 2024, 11:59 p.m.

Full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty with a disciplinary association with science, technology, engineering, or math (STEM) (**broadly defined**) and who are active disciplinary and/or pedagogical scholars are invited to apply for the newly created STEM-NET Faculty Fellows program.

The CSU currently has ten multicampus consortia that conduct collaborative research and education activities on a breadth of topics. STEM-NET constitutes the most extensive of consortia since all 23 campuses are members. The expectation is that STEM-NET will eventually be self-funded through grants and contracts.

STEM-NET empowers CSU STEM leaders to harness their expertise in pedagogy, research, and grant-writing to ensure the success of our students and faculty. Driven by an unwavering commitment to student success, STEM-NET will transform the CSU into a preeminent champion of inclusive access to research and learning experiences that equip diverse STEM students for thriving careers in STEM-related fields.

The call to serve as a Faculty Fellow is to further develop the university's role with STEM-NET. In addition, it is also helping to test the benefits of STEM-NET Faculty Fellows at campuses across the CSU. In subsequent years, the nature and amounts of available funding will depend on the direction taken by the Executive Director in conjunction with the Steering Committee.

Period of appointment: summer 2024 through spring 2025.

Compensation is a summer 2024 stipend of \$5,000 and three (3) semester units (AWTU) for the fall 2024 and spring 2025 semesters.

Reporting: The faculty fellow will report to the provost (or designee).

Responsibilities:

- 1. Work with key faculty to develop and submit targeted STEM-based proposals. The subject areas are to be determined in consultation with the provost (or designee).
- 2. Develop collaborative grants (educational- and research-based) with faculty.
- 3. Help promote a culture of scholarship on campus.
- 4. Take on new initiatives designated by the provost.

Continuation of appointments beyond the initial period is contingent upon budget, organizational needs, and performance.

Application Materials: Please provide a brief cover letter (4 pages maximum) summarizing your background and interest in this position. Include a detailed resume and the contact information for three references in addition to your department chair.
